Detective Pete Swartz has been a member of the Toledo Police Department for the last 29 years. Det. Swartz spent five years working uniform patrol and was then selected to become a Detective in the Toledo Police Vice/Narcotics section where he worked in an undercover capacity for nine years. In 2006 Detective Swartz was assigned to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's - Northwest Ohio Violent Crimes Against Children Task Force (NWOVCACTF) where he investigates sex trafficking matters, specializing in domestic minor sex trafficking investigations. Detective Swartz instructs at the Ohio Police Officer Training Academy (OPOTA) and has taught sex trafficking investigation courses at The Toledo Police Academy as well as throughout the State of Ohio. Det. Swartz is a member of the Ohio Attorney Generals Human Trafficking Commission and a member of the Lucas County Human Trafficking Coalition. Detective Swartz was the 2013 recipient of the Paladin Award and in 2014 the Ohio Liberator Award both awarded for his significant work combating sex trafficking.

Jeff Wilbarger graduated from the University of Toledo in 1987 and has enjoyed teaching students Mathematics & Physics at various high schools and the University of Toledo ever since. Presently he serves as the principal at Toledo Christian high school. Shocked by the reality of trafficking and inspired by God, he founded The Daughter Project in the fall of 2008. Since that time, The Daughter Project family has helped about 50 children and women begin their life-long journey of recovery from sex trafficking. As the founder and director of The Daughter Project, Jeff is a recipient of the Toledo Jefferson Award and is an honorary member of the national Blue Key Honor Society at the University of Toledo. Also, in 2016 he was invited to Washington D.C. to accept the national Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis Award for Exemplary Community Service. Today, Jeff continues to love and serve God by developing relationships with survivors and actively speaking on their behalf.
